# 2017-2018 PROGRAM Highlights

This map showcases 5 of the 675 program sessions we delivered throughout the 9 Bay Area counties

#### San Antonio High

#### (Sonoma County)

San Francisco Gay Men's Chorus presented RHYTHM (Reaching Hearts of Youth Through Hope and Music), a choral performance to 90 students. This performance included choral singing, anecdotes shared by ensemble members, and two in-depth workshops aiming to unite students as allies in solidarity against the pervasive climate of bullying and teen violence.

#### Old Mill Elementary (Marin County)

AXIS Dance Company's mind-opening performance showcased innovative choreography that emphasized collaboration amongst people of all physical abilities to 335 students. Their dance performance Included interactive participation with students, and a candid Q&A with AXIS dancers about dance and disability.

### Longfellow Elementary (San Francisco City & County)

234 students painted ceramic tiles with colorful glazes to compose an underwater seascape mural at their school. This 8-week long residency was conducted by Susan Peterson, a local visual artist specializing in ceramics.

### Benicia High School (Solano County)

SoVoSo (Soul to the Voice to the Song), an a capella ensemble, performed for the entire 1,700 student population at Benicia High. This musical performance honored Black History Month and the contributions of African Americans in the music field. SoVoSo shared their own personal stories, the history of African-American musicians and how they have inspired and changed music for the better: a celebration with the overall message that we are "One Planet, One World, One People."

#### Foothill Elementary (Santa Clara County)

Alphabet Rockers performed "The Playground Zone" for 300 students, raising timely issues about race, ethnicity, neuro diversity, and changing neighborhoods and community. Employing old-school and contemporary hip hop music with street cred in ways that instantly engage young listeners, the highly interactive show engaged students in critical thinking and reflection as they learn dances, beatbox, create handshakes and build a positive school community.
